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

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## **Snacks Crossword Challenge**


Identifying vocabulary words

Encourage your child to be on the lookout for new words each time she reads at home. Whenever an interesting word is found, have your child write it on a piece of paper. Help her look up the word in the dictionary and write a brief definition on the paper. Then, have your child drop the paper in a large container, such as a mayonnaise jar. Every few days, select two or three words and ask her their meanings. If she answers correctly, record the words in a notebook. Every time five new words are remembered, reward your child with a special treat, such as a bookmark or sticker.
